Earlier in November, I wrote to you to inform you of the outcome of our Catholic life inspection, in which we received a 'Good' grade overall with the leadership of Catholic life being graded as outstanding. We are incredibly proud of this achievement and will continue to build on the work that they recognised.

Ofsted

We are finally in a position to share our ofsted report and I am delighted to share that our college has now been awarded a 'Good' rating for behaviour and attitudes, this has improved from requires improvement and is a reflection of the improvements made in recent years. The students did St Mary's proud during the inspection and the sense of collective responsibility for making the school the best that it could be really shone through. The inspectors also commented on how positive the students interact with each other and how responsive the college is when a student has a problem. They were also pleased with our Inspire programme, SEND support, reading approaches, the intent of our curriculum and the subject knowledge and passion of our teachers. This achievement is a result of the tireless efforts of our students, teachers, staff, and, of course, your continued support and positive feedback. These great improvements in less than two years show that leaders have the capacity to make the further improvements identified by the inspectors. This view was supported in our recent Catholic life inspection, a copy of which can be found here.

While celebrating this accomplishment, inspectors also recognised that we still have improvements to make when it comes to the GCSE and A level outcomes and also attendance of the students. As we continue striving for excellence in all aspects of our College it was identified that positive steps taken in recent improvements now need to be applied in these areas. Whilst we are disappointed that inspectors did not find the evidence to move us from requiring improvement overall, the next steps provided by Ofsted aligned completely with what we have identified as our areas of development as we continue to drive to be an outstanding provider of education in the Wallasey community.

Our vision at St Mary's is "Work Together: Succeed Together," and this is at the heart of everything we do. We firmly believe that collaboration between the college and our families is essential to the success of your children. By working together, we can provide them with the tools and opportunities they need to thrive academically and personally.

Our next step is to move from requiring improvement overall towards a good judgement in our next inspection. We believe we now have the solid foundations in place and will be working closely with HFCMAT to drive on improving the outcomes and attendance of all students across St Mary's. Adverse weather

Each year we review our procedures for managing major incidents such as disruption due to poor weather.

We are fully committed to minimising any disruption to the education of our pupils and will always try to keep the school open and operational. There are, however, rare occasions when it may be necessary to close the school, fully or partially. The prime concern of the school will always be the safety of the pupils and staff.

We understand that it may be difficult for some parents to collect their child and so we will ensure school will remain open for any child that needs to remain on site. Attendance

As a key priority, I want to share an honest overview of attendance at St Mary's. Many families are very supportive of our effort to support their child's attendance, this is reflected in the large number of pupils who are regularly recognised for good attendance. This said, our current daily attendance is 87%, when compared against the national average of 92% and our own aspiration target of 95%, we are falling short of what is expected of us.

We now have solid evidence that pupils who do not attend regularly do not achieve well in their GCSE exams, this is not just a national trend but we have the evidence from last year's year 11 and 13 data to show this. Pupils who attended at least 90% of the time made progress in line with national averages. Whilst our published GCSE results are below average, those pupils who attend regularly, take part in revision and extracurricular activities perform well in their exams.

Mr Wilson and the attendance team will continue to drive on improving attendance with the full support of myself and the governors.

Uniform standards and equipment

In January, we will once again work with pupils to ensure they have the correct uniform and equipment. This is vital to ensure they are ready to learn and can make the maximum progress in their lessons. This is an ongoing activity in which we appreciate your support. This year we have also introduced a school stock of uniform to support pupils who arrive without full uniform.

Parent and carer voice

Thank you for taking the time to complete the parent and carer survey this term. This term we saw the most positive responses around the improvements in behaviour and culture and also in the standards of work that are being set across year groups. An area of improvement that you identified is around communication. To support this we are introducing a new link on the website that will allow parents to escalate issues directly to the senior leadership if the normal procedures have not worked.

Your feedback is really important in helping us move forward. This term's survey saw the lowest response that we have had in recent times. I would encourage you to take part in the summer term survey to ensure your voice is heard and your views have a direct influence on college developments.

Parking

During the final weeks of term, we have received a number of complaints and concerns raised regarding parking in and around the college site at the end of the school day. The majority of parents and carers are considerate in their parking, and we thank them for this. However, a significant minority give cause for concern. The School prides itself on being at the heart of our local community and considerate parking goes a long way to positively promote St Mary's in our community. The Department for Transport advises that whilst schools have control over parking on their grounds, they have no jurisdiction over parking outside the school. Nevertheless, when drivers habitually park in an inconsiderate manner, they often cause significant inconvenience and are a danger to themselves, other road users, residents and most of all, to the pupils and staff of the school. I am asking for your support in maintaining a good relationship with our neighbours and ensuring the safety of our pupils and pupils from local primary schools. Would urge all parents and carers who collect pupils in cars to park in places that the highway code considers to be safe and legal.

I would also like to bring your attention to some planned works that will install automatic gates on the vehicle and pedestrian entrances of the main car park. This will limit access to the main car park to

staff and parents who require access as part of a healthcare plan. Once we have a date for this work to start, I will share this with you.

College show

This year's college show is Bugsy and will take place at the Floral Pavilion on Tuesday 13th and Wednesday 14th February 2024. Rehearsals have already started and from what I have seen so far it is going to be a great show. Details on how to purchase tickets will be shared in the New Year.

Leavers and starters

As we approach the end of Autumn term we unfortunately have to say goodbye to a number of staff who are moving to pastures new; Mrs Hickey, Miss McAleer, Mrs Holman, Miss Moore and Mrs Li are all leaving us to take up new roles in other schools. We are incredibly grateful for all that they have done for us at the College and I'm sure you will join me in wishing them well for the future. When we come back in January we will also be welcoming a number of new members of staff. Miss Lee will be joining the Music department. Miss Yates will be joining our Art department, Mrs Tolley will be joining the Social Science department, Mrs Morgan will be joining our Maths department and Mrs Soskin will be joining the Arc team. I look forward to welcoming our new staff on our return in January.

We are also delighted to welcome our new parent governor, Dave Horncastle. Dave was appointed after the vote earlier this term. Dave has already visited the College and will attend his first meeting in the spring term.
