

### GCSE Options - Making Informed Decisions

Your school will let you know about compulsory subjects you must take, for example - English, maths and science. They will also let you know about what other subjects you will make your choices from. Each school will be different in terms of what subjects and qualifications are available.

Your choices can have an impact on your future studies and even your future career, so it's important to make an informed decision.

### Good Vs Bad

#### **Good decisions**

- You're good at the subject
- The subject is linked to careers you're interested in
- The subject is one that you want to study beyond Year 11/ after GCSE
- You like the subject

#### **Bad decisions**

- You are choosing the subject because your friends are doing it!
- You like the teacher!
- Your parents want you to do it!
- You think the subject is easy!
- You don't know what else to choose!
