



Dear Parents and Carers of Year 10 Pupils

As you will probably be aware, today Year 11 pupils begin the 2022 GCSE exam season. We are very proud of how hard they have worked in lessons, revision sessions, Saturday school and also at home. Most of these pupils will be staying on in the Sixth Form with us and we are excited at the prospect of seeing them develop into successful and happy adults.

This time next year, it will be the turn of your child and we wanted to write to you to set out what plans we have for Year 10 to support them in the transition to Year 11 and throughout their really important year, next year.

End of Year 10 Exams: Monday 13th June - Wednesday 29th June

Year 10 End of Year exams will start on Monday 13th June. To give pupils the best balance of support and challenge, we intend to hold Maths, English, Science and RE in the SportsHall - in true exam venue conditions with external invigilators - and other exams in classroom venues, albeit still in exam conditions. Revision Timetables will be sent out separately.

Revision Support

Subject Teachers will begin preparing pupils for the End of Year Exams over the next few days in lessons. Revision guidance and materials for each subject area is available on:

We will be using the results and analysis of the end of year exams to plan summer revision support and adapt and personalise our curriculum offer next year to ensure any gaps pupils have are closed.
