Turning tables





Year 11 and 13 students enjoyed a day of bespoke revision, careers, sixth form and university information alongside an important wellbeing session.


We also welcomed visitors from Liverpool John Moores University to speak to pupils.
















Department Focus: Social Sciences

Studying human behaviour

Social Science is all about studying the different people in society, finding out how to meet their needs and being able to explain why people behave the way they do and how they influence the world around us. Our aim is to support our students to learn about individuals and groups and the context in which we can support them to grow and develop throughout their lives. Under our guidance our students are given the opportunity to excel and gain a wider understanding of society and their place within it. We want them to become empathetic individuals that understand the reasons for human behaviour and ways in which we can support people to overcome difficulties in their lives throughout all of the life stages.

It's been a busy year with classes working on a range of topics and most recently, students working towards final exams and coursework.

Year 10 Psychology

Our Year 10 Students have been learning about development this term and how children learn. They have now moved on to research methods and how psychologists go about researching their hypothesis and the methods they use, for example experiments, observations and questionnaires. Well done to Giulio Fontana and Lily Lloyd for their consistent performance across the year.


Year 12 Psychology

■ Year 12 Sociology



Our students are also currently developing their own investigations, exploring a range of topics in society through a range of sociological research methods.

Year 13 Sociology

Yr 13 Sociology are learning about beliefs in society considering the importance of beliefs for individuals and society and most recently considering if science is a belief system. They have just finished learning the topic of Crime and Deviance, and how the media can influence patterns and trends of crime. Students enjoyed exploring why disadvantaged communities may resort to crime to meet the expectations society in the media imposes on them. This student has presented an excellent analysis of this topic, showing his dedication to revising and demonstrating his exam skills.





Year 10 Health & Social Care

Yr 10 Health and Social Care have been working on the first piece of coursework which is due to be sent off in a couple of weeks. They have worked really hard on a series of challenging tasks related to how we grow and develop and the different life events that can have an impact on us. The whole class has worked really hard to get their work in on time but particular well done for getting it in early goes to Lily Lloyd!

Year 11 Health & Social Care

Yr 11 Health & Social Care completed role plays to demonstrate the importance of the Care Values in Health and Social Care for their final piece of work. They threw themselves into this task and are all showing excellent understanding and application.

Yr 12 Health & Social Care have been busy completing coursework and preparing for their exam. In their coursework they have been studying 'Meeting Individual Care Needs' and have been learning about human growth and development for their exam, including different theories of development for example Piaget. Most recently, they have focussed on the issues around an ageing population in our society for Health and Social Care provision. This half term, students have also been exploring how health and safety are promoted within settings such as hospitals and care homes, analysing the way rights are promoted for service users so they get the best quality care possible. This is a difficult topic to understand as professionals must balance rights with the risk of harm to service users, but it is evident our students have showed resilience and understand the concept completely. 
Year 13 Health & Social Care






Year 11 Child Development


