Where can I purchase the College Uniform?

What support is there to help Year 7 settle into College life?

- Delivery of sessions related to timetables, organisation, homework and routines during Inspire Time
- Year 7 have an extended lunchtime
- There are designated toilets solely for use by Year 7 students
- Year 7 have their own playground
- Summer School programme





How does the school decide which form group my child is in?

We collect information from your primary schools and ask them to recommend learning partners. These are peers that work well together to bring out the best in each other.

Where possible, we try to ensure that students have at least one child from their primary school in their form. We find that students develop new friendships very quickly and our specialist transition team ensure that children are supported in doing this.

We provide additional support for students who are the only child coming from their primary school.





How will my child find their way around the building?

- Students will be escorted to lessons by members of staff for their first two weeks
- College Tours
- College Maps
- College policy Consistent staff presence on corridors





What are the arrangements for lunchtimes?

We operate a cashless system which can be topped up via students bringing cash into school to top up their account or via parentpay.

A main meal is currently priced at £2.41

If your child is entitled to FSM, this will automatically be carried over from primary school ready for your child's first day.



In the event of a child forgetting their lunch money, they will need to inform the Progress and Aspiration Coach who will arrange a loan for the day.





Will my child get homework?

We use homework to consolidate and extend learning that has taken place in lessons.

As part of our induction process we support our pupils in learning how to use GoogleClassroom and how to record and track homework.

Support is available every night after school in our Year 7 homework club.



How will I know what kind of day my child has had?

Teachers use a system called arbor to log all positive behaviour and to detail any concerns.

The app will allow parents/carers to keep up to date with various aspects of their child's performance in school.

Login details will be issued to parents during the induction process.





How will my child travel to and from school?

We encourage children to walk or cycle to College if possible. There is a secure area inside College for students to lock up their bicycles.

The nearest train stations are Wallasey Village and Wallasey Grove Road, both stations are approximately a 5 -10 minute walk to College.

There are a number of school buses available to transport students to and from College. Further information is available on our website. There are also public bus stops in close proximity to the Village.

To ensure the safety of our students, we encourage parents and carers to avoid dropping off children either in the College Car park or outside the front of College.





What Extra-Curricular opportunities are available?

We will encourage your child to fully immerse themselves in our extra-curricular programme.

There are many activities on offer at lunchtime and after school including netball, football, basketball, trampolining, rugby, badminton, rounders, dodgeball, dance, choir, Ukulele, Harry Potter club and Dungeons and Dragons club to name a few.

If your child enjoys Drama they may also have the opportunity to perform in one of our College shows at the Floral Pavillion.

During your child's time at SMCC there are a number of opportunities for residential visits for your child to take part in. Recent trips include: Ski trip to Italy, Morocco and Alton Castle.
