#### A year of celebration

As we reach the end of a truly remarkable school year, I am filled with pride and gratitude for the collective efforts and achievements of our staff, students, and supportive parents. There are simply too many things to list to exemplify our successes, however we try to capture the events of each half term in our newsletter. Some key highlights for me this year are that we welcomed an oversubscribed Year 7 cohort in September and celebrated the success of a new year group in our ARC provision. We were pleased to receive a good rating from Ofsted for behaviour and from the Catholic life inspection for our leadership. Our students have had incredible opportunities to broaden their horizons and show courage, including a ski trip to Italy and a cultural exchange to Morocco in February, as well as a poignant Year 13 trip to Auschwitz. We launched a new teaching and learning strategy, which has resulted in improved student engagement in lessons and the successful implementation of a scholars programme across all year groups. Additionally, our fully funded experience week for all students was a resounding success.

I am particularly proud of the growth of our diversity group, which has gone from strength to strength, embodying our commitment to inclusivity and representation. It was also great to be a part of the Duke of Edinburgh bronze award expedition earlier in this term and I look forward to seeing this grow in the coming years. None of these accomplishments would have been possible without the hard work from staff and support of our parents, for which I am deeply grateful.

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### Uniform and equipment standards

Please find a link <u>here</u> to our uniform and expectations policy, this policy has remained in place for a number of years. We will continue to provide uniform to those students that arrive at school without any correct items. It is likely we will move to a deposit system for items of borrowed uniform in the new academic year. It is important that our students continue embody our core value of pride by adhering to these expectations,

It is also essential that all students are well equipped for lessons. Students need a St Mary's College bag, a pencil case with black or blue ink ballpoint pens, pencils, a sharpener, a rubber, a ruler, a protractor and compass, some colouring pencils and a scientific (natural display) calculator. Equipment is also available to purchase at school. Students are also advised to bring in water in a refillable bottle as sugary fizzy drinks, including any form of energy drink, are not permitted at St Mary's and will be disposed of.

As we approach the end of the year if you are able to donate any uniform that you no longer need it would be greatly appreciated. We are in particular need of smaller sizes of blazers, skirts and PE Kits. There is a box in Reception where items can be dropped off at any time, including over the summer break.

As it stands we confiscate mobile phones, jewellery and other banned items from students and they are available to collect again at the end of the school day. I am proposing that during the next academic year, where persistence confiscation of items occurs by the same student, a system would be initiated in which a parent, or other appropriate adults would need to collect the items on behalf of the students. ### **Attendance & Punctuality**

Attendance is a key priority at St Mary's and as it stands a large number of students do not attend school at the same levels as schools locally or nationally. This is concerning and adds an additional level of scrutiny from external stakeholders such as Ofsted. I need the whole school community to work together on attendance in this coming year and ensure that students attend everyday, apart only in extreme circumstances. There is new national guidance that is coming to effect in September which means I will be unable to authorise a number of activities that in the past have been authorised, there is also new national guidance around increasing the use of Fixed Penalty Notices.

Where there are barriers to attendance I urge parents to open up a dialogue immediately with us so we can work together to overcome these issues. To help me understand the issues more closely I will be setting up regular meetings with parents of students whose attendance is showing signs of becoming an issue.

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#### **Catering Prices from September**

#### **New Automated gates**

Last year I wrote to you to inform you that we have successfully won a bid to install automatic gates at the front of school. This was in response to a small number of safeguarding issues and to ensure the school site was safe for students and visitors.

Both the pedestrian and vehicular gates that lead onto the main car park will be automated to control the flow of cars and students during the day. The vehicle gates will close at 08:20 am each morning and will remain closed until 3:15pm in the afternoon. The pedestrian gate will close at 08:35 am each morning and open at 3:05pm in the afternoon. To support this the school car park will no longer be used for dropping and collecting students at the start and end of the school day.
